Caroline Goldthorpe, our speaker
**Will present "From Queen to Empress;
Victorian Dress 1837-1877"**

On this day October 15 in 1839 Queen Victoria proposed to her cousin Prince Albert. As Queen, convention required *her* to be the one to propose since she was so much his senior in social rank.

Celebrate with us as costume specialist Caroline Goldthorpe shares a fascinating insight into the Victorian Woman through the study of her dress. This exceedingly rich period of costume history and social etiquette was the subject of a highly successful exhibition which Caroline curated when she was at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, including documented dresses worn by Queen Victoria.

With writings from the period enhanced by images of contemporary fashions, portraits and illustrations Caroline will weave together a picture of costume for men and women at a time when etiquette in dress, of the sort that we use now only at weddings, was usual and understood in all areas of upper and middle-class life.

(Caroline is currently the Director of the Museum Studies Program at Northwestern University)

Fill out an application at the Circulation desk and show a picture ID and proof of mailing address. Children under the age of 13 need a parent's or guardian's signature to get a card. A person with a library card issued by any other public library in New Mexico is eligible to receive a Santa Fe Public Library card. Please fill it out and bring to any library branch with picture ID and proof of mailing address to get a card.
